What Is Your Greatest Need?

Central Truth: When we ask for what is truly our greatest need, our prayers are answered.

What is your greatest need?	

Read 1 John 5:14-15; John 15:7. Do you really believe them? Break into groups to discuss the following passages:

Mark 10:35-41 10:35 And James and John, the two sons of Zebedee, came up to Him, saying to Him, "Teacher, we want You to do for us whatever we ask of You."	Mark 10:46-52 10:46 And they came to Jericho. And as He was going out from Jericho with His disciples and a great multitude, a blind beggar <i>named</i> Bartimæus, the son of Timæus, was sitting by the road. 47 And when he heard that it was Jesus the Nazarene, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" 48 And many were sternly telling him to be quiet, but he kept crying out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" 49 And Jesus stopped and said, "Call him <i>here</i> ." And they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take courage, arise! He is calling for you." 50 And casting aside his cloak, he jumped up, and came to Jesus.

And Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you shall drink; and you shall be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized. ⁴⁰ "But to sit on My right or on <i>My</i> left, this is not Mine to give; but it is for those for whom it has been prepared."	52And Jesus said to him, "Go your way; your faith has made you well."
⁴¹ And hearing this, the ten began to feel indignant with James and John.	And immediately he regained his sight and <i>began</i> following Him on the road. (=Luke 18:43 - And immediately he regained his sight, and <i>began</i> following Him, glorifying God; and when all the people saw it, they gave praise to God.)
