10 High priest brings national Passover lamb into Jerusalem via the East Gate. It is kept in the temple for four days of inspection. Crowd of priests and onlookers celebrate, sing Ps. 118, lay palm branches in the road. <i>Jesus' triumphal entry and "inspection".</i>	11 The national lamb is on display in the temple, being scrutinized by the priests. All of the families were becoming attached to the lamb they had selected for sacrifice. <i>Jesus was on display, being inspected by the priests.</i>	12 Same. <i>Same.</i>	13 Same. <i>The disciples ask Jesus about His plans for the Passover. He instructs them where to go to make arrangements.</i>	14 On the evening before, the father of each house would play a game with the children to hide bread crumbs and have them find it. 17 High priest waves first fruit offerings in the temple, thanking God for the first of the harvest. <i>Jesus resurrected sometime before dawn.</i>	18	19	20

Jesus ate the "last supper" Passover meal with His disciples on Wednesday evening. During the ceremony, He took the middle piece of matzah and hid it, symbolizing His burial. "This is My body." Afterward, He went to the garden, was arrested, tried, and sentenced to die. He was hung on the cross at 9AM. He died at 3PM, at the same time all of the lambs were being sacrificed. The veil in the temple was torn from the top to bottom.
